Minutes of a Meeting of Great Ayton Parish Council

held on Tuesday 11th May 1999 at 7.00 pm

Present

Election of officers

Councillor Groves welcomed new Parish Councillor Mrs F Greenwell.

Councillor Mrs Imeson was proposed as Chairman by Councillor Mrs Stevens but regretfully declined. Councillor Kirk was proposed as Chairman by Councillor Mrs Imeson, seconded by Councillor Groves and was unanimously elected.

Councillor Mrs Imeson was proposed as Vice Chairman by Councillor Groves, seconded by Councillor Mrs Stevens and unanimously elected.

Minutes

Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 13th April 1999 were approved and signed.

Police Business

A letter from residents of Park Rise complaining about youngsters causing noise and nuisance in the arcade and library car park area, and a reply from Sgt McArdle, were read to the Parish Council. Further reports were heard of vandalism and intimidation by a gang, some of whose members were believed to be as young as seven. The clerk was instructed to write to Sgt McArdle thanking him for his detailed response and assuring the police of the support of the Parish Council in efforts to deal with the problem.

Matters arising

<u>Ayton School Development/lease for sports field</u> A letter from Mr Sillars on behalf of the Royal Oak Taverners was read to the meeting expressing their dismay at the continuing delay. It was pointed out that there is no money being expended at present and as soon as the lease is signed it will be "all systems go". The clerk is to contact Southalls to enquire as to the cause of the delay.

<u>Bushes, Roseberry Cres/Ave</u> Three new bushes have been purchased and planted. Residents had asked if a formal bed could be made. Their letter is to be forwarded to Highways for consideration. <u>Tree guards Rotary, trees Langbaurgh corner</u> It was reported that the tree guards had arrived and were at Mr Leslie Martin's. The clerk is to ask if he would mind storing them until the trees are planted in the autumn.

Whitbread bridge It was agreed that a contractor would need to be hired to carry out the work.

<u>Internet/computers</u> A letter from Roseberry School Governors indicated their interest in Teesside University's scheme. The clerk is to contact Mr Dave Eagle to find out how to progress.

Trees, bushes and alder saplings, Low Green Completed.

Memorial seat - Dr Dodd A memorial ceremony attended by Dr Dodd's family and members of the Parish Council was followed by coffee at the Royal Oak.

<u>Cemetery mower</u> Mr Winn is to be asked for the literature on the strimmer.

<u>Play area - plan for improvement</u> Estimates for security fencing are awaited. It was reported that there had been a tent in the play area for 4 days. HDC are to be asked how the byelaws can be enforced. The safety surface for the roundabout had been replaced but it was reported that the quality of the concrete base was poor. It was agreed that if further problems arose the contractor be contacted again. A plea for parents to help with the play area was again made. The sub-committee are to deal with the improvement plan without report.

<u>CAPE Scheme - fencing Low Green</u> A representative from HDC agreed that the scheme was feasible and meritorious but would be too expensive. Councillor Fletcher is to investigate prices.

Footbridge - Low Green To be chased up

<u>Flower tubs/sponsorship</u> Mr Featherstone is willing to take on two more tubs. The supplier has none in stock at present. It was agreed that the footpath by the chemist's was too narrow for troughs to be affixed to the wall. The Village Hall railings was suggested as an alternative site. Councillor Mrs Imeson is to speak to Mr Eric Kendall about filling the troughs on the toilet wall. A request was made for volunteers to help the extremely overworked people who presently look after the troughs and tubs.

<u>Community Service jobs</u> The cemetery railings were added to the list of jobs.

<u>Rubbish, Romany Road</u> It was reported that mice had been seen. The clerk is to contact HDC again. <u>Highways matters - fence near Suggitts, grass Newton Road, trod Linden Grove</u> Minute continued. <u>Advertisement, Wimpey Homes</u> A letter explaining Wimpey's position was received.

<u>Domesday book</u> Mrs Essex reported that good progress was being made, and more people were helping since the request had appeared in the Stream. A map is to be placed in the library highlighting areas not covered. It was suggested that a photograph be taken of the whole village population, probably in the autumn.

<u>Ball</u> The Dudley Arms was reported to be doing the bar. The clerk is to confirm with Jack Wood <u>Fireworks</u> A short, sharp firework display to herald the New Year was suggested. Several Councillors felt that a longer display would be preferable. Councillor Fletcher is to investigate further and the matter will be discussed again at the next meeting.

Councillors' reports

Councillor Bell proposed that Brian Winn be thanked for his years of service and conscientious approach to his work as Parish Councillor. This was unanimously agreed and the clerk is to write accordingly. He commented on the superior quality of grass cutting at Stokesley compared to that carried out in Great Ayton by NYCC. He believed that Stokesley PC arranged their own verge cutting and were paid by NYCC to do so. The clerk is to contact Stokesley PC to enquire what their arrangements are. The light in the ladies public toilet is not working. HDC are to be contacted.

Councillor Fletcher commented on the speed of traffic and heavy lorries in Guisborough Road. He reported that traffic calming measures were being considered. The clerk is to make enquiries of NYCC Highways to discover what is being proposed.
