Minutes of a Meeting of Great Ayton Parish Council

held on Tuesday 28th November 2000 at 7.00 pm

Present

Councillors Mrs J Imeson, Chairman, R Kirk, Mrs F Greenwell, Mrs M Stevens, L Groves, P Bell, J Fletcher. Sgt R Walls also attended.

Minutes

Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 31st October 2000 were approved and signed.

Police Business

Sgt Walls apologised for the lack of police representation at previous meetings. He reported that from 1st April to date there had been a 14% reduction in overall crime compared to last year. There was still a high rate of auto crime. One arrest had been made following theft of diesel from Pearsons. House burglaries were down and shed and garage burglaries about the same. Councillor Mrs Greenwell said that people should be extra vigilant during the dark evenings approaching Christmas. It was suggested that people leave lights and TV on when they went out. Councillor Bell asked if there had been any prosecutions of cyclists riding on pavements. There had been none. The Parish Council said that old people, the deaf and visually impaired were particularly vulnerable to cyclists on the pavement. Sgt Walls said that such cyclists were stopped when observed. He could arrange a day at school in conjunction with road safety to bring the matter to the attention of children.

It was reported that the youth club in the village hall was no longer ongoing. It had been successful but staffing was a problem. Outreach workers were currently being interviewed. Methodist Youth Club leaders were also being trained.

Matters arising

<u>High Green bylaws etc</u> It was suggested that big youths deterred small children from playing on the Green. Other facilities were available to older children including the new public open space. Councillor Fletcher said that people playing ball games were not the problem. It was malicious youths breaking windows deliberately who caused the problems and there was provision for dealing with them in the existing bylaws. The Council resolved by 4 votes to 3 to ban all ball games on High Green. Councillor Kirk would bring the existing bylaws up to date.

Whitbread bridge It was reported that this would be completed in 2 to 3 weeks.

<u>Community Service jobs</u> Work on the fencing at Waterfall Terrace would be completed the coming weekend. Work would recommence at other locations in the spring.

<u>Highways matters - footbridges Low Green</u> NYCC had completed the repair to the concrete bridge. The wooden bridge would be rebuilt shortly.

Village Hall Minute continued

Access - 2 Easby Lane Minute continued.

<u>Parking outside shops/station car park</u> Northern Spirit agreed to sign being erected directing walkers to the station car park. Mr D Ferguson asked if the Parish Council would share the cost of maintenance for the car park road, to which he contributes. As Northern Spirit had not suggested the Parish Council contribute he would be advised to dispute any increase in his costs with Northern Spirit. HDC would be asked to provide a suitable sign to be displayed in the TIC car park.

<u>WI Tree for Millennium</u> The Parish Council were asked if they would provide a tree guard. This request was rejected and the WI would be advised that the blacksmith at Carlton may be able to supply one.

Public toilet signs It was reported that HDC had the signs ready to install

<u>Mr D Williams - photocall</u> Councillor Fletcher would arrange a date. Minute concluded.

<u>Arcade</u> HDC reported on their inspection of the arcade. Their offer to contact Mowden Park Estate Company about the condition of the paving stones was accepted by the Parish Council.

Beehive bins These had been modified. Minute concluded.

<u>Cemetery extension</u> It was agreed by 4 votes to 3 that a close boarded fence be erected to protect the young trees and to protect residents and young children from witnessing funerals.

<u>Lampposts - Pearsonville</u> HDC would be unable to re-instate lampposts this financial year. Matter concluded. <u>Trees - trod at rear of Cliffe Terrace</u> Minute continued.

<u>Ginnel - Hall fields</u> Smiths Gore had agreed to the Parish Council improving the ginnel. The recent heavy rain had made the path completely impassable, however, and Smiths Gore would be asked to look at rectifying the drainage problem first.

Health Centre - repeat prescriptions Minute continued.

Transfer of POS Concluded.

Sublet of playing fields Minute continued

Stile/kissing gate - cricket field Minute continued

Road name sign - Richardson Hall The misleading road name signs had been removed but two of the new

Roseberry Crescent sign Minute continued

Computer for clerk After much debate it was agreed to defer the decision for 1 month.

Road sweeper The mechanical sweeper had been in action in the village. Addison Road had been missed and HDC would be contacted again. It was noted that the regular street cleaner did an excellent job.

Councillor Fletcher would arrange for the posters to be printed. The float would commence its tour at 5.30 from Pearsons' yard. The Parish Council would carry out the collection at the carol singing. The annual Parish Council dinner was arranged for 26th January 2001.

Councillors' reports

Councillor Mrs Imeson defended the NYCC and HDC set-up for dealing with the floods. There were problems throughout the district with which they had dealt very well. She suggested, and it was agreed, that a letter be sent to the Environment Agency asking for compensation for Ayton people whose houses had been flooded. It was believed that the sluice gates at Stokesley had not been opened soon enough and there was no need for Ayton to have been flooded at all. A letter would also be sent to Mr M Moore, NYCC, saying that the flooding might not have been so severe had the drains been regularly cleared.

Councillor Kirk said that he had had several complaints from people who did not know who to ring for help in the floods.

Councillor Fletcher proposed that the seat which had been stolen from the corner of Easby Lane/Cross Lane be replaced. This was agreed. The clerk would investigate the cost of insuring seats.

Councillor Mrs Greenwell remarked on the excellent quality of grass cutting this year. She reported that one of the flower tubs opposite the post office had been knocked over by a vehicle. It was agreed to write to the guilty party to ask for recompense for the tub.

Councillor Mrs Stevens reported that the gate at the play area had been lowered and the sides fenced in.
