## Minutes of a Meeting of Great Ayton Parish Council

# held on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2009 at 7.00 pm

## Present

Councillors N Waters, Chairman, J Fletcher, Mrs J Imeson, Mrs F Greenwell, D Conroy, G Readman and R Kirk. PC G Jones, Mr H Atkinson and Mr P Suggitt also attended.

#### Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2009 were approved and signed.

#### **Police Business**

PC Jones, who had kindly attended on his day off, reported on the previous month's events. He said that there had been fewer complaints regarding antisocial behaviour. Twelve to fifteen youths had been taken into custody for questioning regarding damage to property and four were to be prosecuted. A distraction burglary had been carried out at Church Drive by men posing as water board officials.

Councillor Fletcher said that there had been problems on High Green again, and Councillor Kirk asked if there was any evidence that the troublemakers had taken their activities elsewhere. Councillor Mrs Greenwell suggested that the play area be made a "respect area". PC Jones said that it would have to be done through 4Youth. Mr Atkinson said that there had been a 100% improvement in the play area and there had been no damage to equipment. Councillor Waters said that he was aware that there had been a number of thefts, or attempted thefts, from farms.

PC Jones said that the police helicopter had been deployed to an incident at Kildale and the perpetrators caught. PC Jones was thanked for attending.

## Cemetery and play area - play area hedge/paved area; repairs to equipment

Mr Atkinson reported a very busy month. A new dog-waste bin in the cut between Central Way and Guisborough Road, which was being well used, had been removed. He understood that it had been taken away for use at Stokelsey.

Councillor Readman was awaiting advice from the Health and Safety people at HDC regarding repairs to play equipment. The goalposts would be relocated to allow the grass to recover.
