Cllr Fletcher confirmed that the bench would be moved forward by 2ft and would be done over the next few weeks dependent on staff availability. Noted. The Chairman from the Tennis Club made representation seeking support from the Parish Council to make

16/01108/TUC – Land East of Langbaurgh Ridge – Proposed installation of a telecommunications base station (amended location to original consultation). *Members preference would be for this firm to use the mast that is already in situation rather than see the installation of another one.*

16/01106/FUL - Greenhow Moor Farm, Pannierman Lane - Construction of a dwelling and detached domestic garage. *Members strongly oppose this application on the grounds that it destroys the countryside and it is not sustainable.*

9 Clerk's Report

Hall Fields Footpath - Cllr Moorhouse continues to progress this issue but funding limitations would mean that all the maintenance work required could not be completed but the History Society was looking to carry out some of the work on behalf of NYCC. **Noted.**

High Street Parking - Cllrs Flether and Mrs Greenwell had completed the survey on Saturday 23 July 2016. Members thanked them for undertaking this work and noted the detail within the report. It was agreed that Cllr Taylor would submit the report to the Business Forum for their information and they were welcome to see the photographs taken with a view to obtaining their thoughts and to see if they could identify vehicles which were parked for a long time i.e. belonging to people other than shoppers. **Agreed.**

10 Accounts Report

The total payments made were £11586.15.

The total receipts received were £1988.50.

11 Councillors Reports

Clir Mrs Brown - the footpath along Guisborough Road was nearly impassable because of the overgrown hedge. The Clerk was asked to contact the landowner to request that it be cut back. **Agreed.**

Clir Mrs Taylor had attended the Business Forum and as agreed had identified three candidates to join the Events Sub Group, it was agreed that Clirs Mrs Taylor, Mrs Greenwell, Mrs Brown and Hudson would represent the Parish Council on this group. The initial request received was that the Christmas Tree be erected for a Christmas Event that will take place on 26 November 2016. **Noted.**

Cllr Readman advised that he and Cllr Mrs Taylor had undertaken an investigation in to the requirement for additional dropped kerbs and reported that the Village was well serviced with dropped kerbs apart from two specific areas. The stone bridge has a dropped kerb at what end but not the other and this causes a number of issues, the second area of concern was the dropped kerb on the opposite side of Hollygarth which is to far around the corner meaning that people trying to cross there cannot see around it. Cllr Readman had contacted NYCC and requested that they come and look at these areas with a view to improving. Noted. It was reported that the main problem continues to be inconsiderate parking and despite some recent ticketing by traffic enforcement residents continue to park inappropriately. The Clerk was asked to send a press release with a photograph to the media to ask that they publicise this ongoing problem. Agreed.

Clir Kirk asked that the cutting back of the trees at the Cemetery be arranged to ensure the lights are visible. **Agreed.**

Clir Flether sought agreement to strim the large area under the stone bridge, then rot-ovate it and plant with wild flowers. **Agreed.**
