6 Council Services Report

Cemetery

Captain Cook Memorial Garden

The works in the Cook family memorial garden is progressing well. Cllr Robinson confirmed that work towards the website & signs were in motion. Turf would be laid only if it was felt that it would thrive otherwise this would be delayed until early spring. **Ongoing**

Public Conveniences

The Parish Council's decision to carry out a significant overhaul of the Public WC's requires that a formal specification be sought from a professional organisation specialising in such. **Ongoing**

Whitbread / Waterfall Bridge

Cllr Fletcher confirmed that 3 tenders had been re-validated for the manufacture of a replacement bridge. HDC confirmed that grant funding was looking positive. The Clerk was asked to proceed with the planning application for the installation of a new bridge. **Ongoing**

Public Footpaths

Having received a formal 'witnessed' report of fouling it was agreed that this should be referred to the dog warden to enable a Community Protection Notice approach to be taken. It was further agreed that posters should be affixed in the worst affected locations to try to trigger a positive reaction from irresponsible dog owners. **Ongoing**

Children's Play Park

Maintenance works are to take place following the next annual RoSPA inspection which took place in September.

11/11/18 'Battles Over' event. After brief discussion it was agreed that the event on the High Green should take place in accordance with Cllr Mrs Taylor / Cllr Fletchers suggestions. This community event includes the lighting of a small symbolic beacon at 7pm and words in remembrance of those who lost their lives in WW1. **Agreed**

18/00692/FUL - East Angrove Farm REVISED APPLICATION

Delegated decision - Change of use and conversion of former agricultural building to a wedding venue. (REVISED APPLICATION)

The revised application does not change the material concern of Great Ayton Parish Council previously expressed in May 18. Access off the A173 is much improved but, it remains of concern that the property entrance is still an issue due to potentially large numbers of vehicles entering/exiting across a short timeframe. No objections to the proposed use.

18/02022/FUL - Land adjacent to Angrove Plantation, Yarm Lane REVISED APPLICATION

Delegated Decision - Proposed agricultural building for cattle, farm machinery and other equipment.

The revised application does not change the material concerns of Great Ayton Parish Council previously expressed in October 18. The Parish Council wishes to see further evidence to show that a sustainable business can be run from theses premises. The unusual nature of the proposed building contents and numerous vehicular movements remains a cause for concern. We have requested that a formal site visit take place to review the proposals & concerns.

The Parish Council will not trigger the process ahead of the 2019 elections since it is not possible to complete the consultation process prior to this. **Ongoing**

Parish Handyperson

Following a formal recruitment process the Parish Council are pleased to confirm that Paul Wood has been appointed as the new part time Handyperson.

10 Councillors Reports

Endeavour Way

Cllr Fletcher had confirmed that the Endeavour Way the cycle track project from Stokesley to Great Ayton was moving slowly due to land lease and/or purchase discussions. Discussion was still required between Great Ayton PC & Stokesley TC to confirm agreement of a joint understanding regarding maintenance. **Ongoing**

Easby Lane flooding

This item will remain on the Agenda/Minutes until such time as an effective solution is reached. Noted

Parish Council Assets: Cllr Robinson has previously requested that the Asset Register be brought up to date and include land within the report. **Ongoing**

Chain & Bars: It was agreed that the chains of office be sent to Thomas Fattorini Ltd (Birmingham) for modifications to accept new bars. There is a shortfall of 7 years bars and hence previous/current chair-persons are not named. **Agreed**

Ex Tourist Information Building: Remedial actions will take place by HDC prior to occupancy. It was suggested that the Parish Council did not require all the services currently installed within the ex-TIC building and Cllr Hudson suggested that the telephone contract should be allowed to lapse. **Ongoing**

Xmas lighting improvements to Village Green: The Parish Council discussed alternative ideas that might be workable but concluded that significant underground improvements could not be undertaken close to Christmas. The Parish Council remain keen to seek improvements to the Christmas lighting for 2019. As in previous years a 34' tree has been reserved by Maynards nurseries in Great Broughton and Cllr Fletcher confirmed that volunteers would collect/erect the Christmas Tree on 3rd / 4th December. **Noted**

Trees

A number of trees have become damaged during recent high winds some of these were owned by the Parish Council, others were not but have been attended to at the Parish Council's expense. An advisory document has been received from the PC's insurance company describing inspection / maintenance practices to try to avoid the need for insurance claims. It was agreed that the Clerk should draft a policy for the management of Parish Council owned trees and to include the safe disposal of wind damaged branches.

Waterfall Park

Having received a report from Caryn Loftus (Moor Sustainable CIC) giving detailed suggestions for development of Waterfall Park and the River Leven along the profile of Great Ayton, it was agreed that Moor Sustainable should be asked to take the lead in developing their ideas (subject to PC approval) and that the BUGA's would form part of the volunteer group in future.

11 Accounts Report

The total payments made were £11,963.23 The total income received was £6,200.74

It was noted that the annual 'Cook's Day of Sail' should appear on the agenda for approval each year as the associated costs (eg lunches for dignitaries) should be approved in advance by the Parish Council.

Parish Precept: As part of the HDC budget process the Parish Precept will need to be set by 31/12/18 as instructed by Hambleton District Council. It was agreed that the Precept would be set as part of the December PC meeting along with the 2019/20 budget.
